

Solid Waste Basic Rate (includes construction & demolition debris)	\$81	\$20

Yard Trimmings & Food Scraps Yard trimmings and food scraps only. No bags, packaging, garbage or debris. No raw meat or liquids. No palm trees or fronds, succulents, cactus, genista (brooms) or poison oak. Sod may be accepted at this rate.	\$49	\$15
Commercial Food Scraps Clean loads of food scraps, cannabis, and BPI and CMA-W Certified Compostable Products from pre-approved generators and/or venues, events	\$69	\$15
Clean Dimensional Lumber No treated or painted wood, cedar shakes. Cannot be mixed with other materials, including yard trimmings.	\$49	\$15
Logs and Stumps Greater than 3 feet in any dimension	\$112	\$50

Accepted Items

What's Recyclable in Monterey County?

- Clean, mixed paper and cardboard
- Plastic bottles and containers labeled #1, #2 and #5
- Glass bottles and jars
- Aluminum cans and metal containers
- Large rigid plastics, like laundry baskets, pails, crates, lawn furniture or food storage containers
- Scrap metal

What's NOT Recyclable in Your Blue Cart?

- Plastic bags
- Batteries and battery-embedded products
- Hoses, wires and other items that can tangle recycling equipment
- Clothing and textiles
- Electronics (e-waste)
- Appliances

Do you ever wonder if the items you place in your blue cart are actually being recycled? ReGen Monterey processes over 250 tons of recyclables per day through our Materials Recovery Facility. These materials are sorted, baled and delivered to manufacturers to make new products. By recycling, you give new life to items that would otherwise wind up landfilled.



Edible Food Recovery

According to a 2022 Community Health Needs Assessment by the Monterey County Health Needs Collaborative, [over 40 percent of Monterey County residents are food insecure](#). ReGen Monterey offers resources to help feed local families in need while keeping edible food out of the landfill.

Food recovery is one step toward reaching these goals. The food recovery process involves collecting edible food that might go to waste and distributing it to people in need. Nonprofits and food rescue organizations help make this happen, and ReGen helps  this important work.
