By compositing, we keep enganics just bitminings and foodscraps) out of landfills and preserve our top sole. The benefits of compost include building healthy sol, conserving water, reducing greenhouse gas emissions, and saving money. We also help our cities and county meet the requirements of state mandated waste reduction and recycling laws including SEISE3, A8 939, A8341, and SEIRE6.

The District offers several compost programs to the community; green waste, commercial food scrap, and home composting,

Food Scrap Composting

Beginning January 1, 2022 residents can add accepted food scraps to their proon curtiside cart. Food scrap collection is part of the implementation of California's SB ISB (signation addressing climate pollutants and wanted tool. We look traveard to supporting everyone's participation and success. Please check out the acceptance list for what you can put that the the cart with your yand trimmings - including trimmings from your produce, the incidele parts of tool e.g. shells and bones, plate scrapings, spoleid food, all but raw meat and ligadis including ols. Please do not put plastic, paper or biodegradable/compostable bags into your green cart - only organic institution.

Refise Montercy's commercial compost program sorves commercial customers including restaurants, hotels, supermarkets, and a range of special events. Participation in the program ensures local businesses meet the equirements of ABI326 and SB 1383, the state's new organics necycling laws. If you are a commercial business and wish to start compositing food scraps, please contact your waste and recycling service previder to discuss collection service.

The commercial compost program accepts compostable packaging (cups, plates, cuttery, bags) that have received Biologenable Products institute (BPI) cartification. For a list of products that carry this cortification, clease visit BPIs website.

#### What's Recyclable in Monterey County?

- · Clean, mixed paper and cardboard
- Plastic bottles and containers labeled #1, #2 and #5
- · Glass bottles and jars
- · Aluminum cans and metal containers
- · Large rigid plastics, like laundry baskets, pails, crates, lawn furniture or food storage containers Scrap metal

#### What's NOT Recyclable in Your Blue Cart?

- · Plastic bags
- · Batteries and battery-embedded products
- · Hoses, wires and other items that can tangle recycling equipment
- · Clothing and textiles
- Electronics (e-waste)
- Appliances

Do you ever wonder if the items you place in your blue cart are actually being recycled? ReGen Monterey processes over 250 tons of recyclables per day through our Materials Recovery Facility. These materials are sorted, baled and delivered to manufacturers to make new products. By recycling, you give new life to items that would otherwise wind up landfilled.

## Edible Food Recovery

According to a 2022 Community Health Needs Assessment by the Monterey County Health Needs Collaborative, over 40 percent of Monterey County residents are food insecure. ReGen Monterey offers resources to help feed local families in need while keeping edible food out of the landfill.

Food recovery is one step toward reaching these goals. The food recovery process involves collecting edible food that might go to waste and distributing it to people in need. Nonprofits and food rescue organizations help make this happen, and ReGen helps this important work.
